WELCOME (Shake hands, give high-fives, write name tags, and connect with other students.)

ICEBREAKER (Don't skip this part! This helps people connect and start conversation!)

- *Have you ever been asked to do something, but felt unprepared to do it? How did it turn out?*

READ: Exodus 3:10-12 NLT

“So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt.’ But Moses said to God, ‘Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?’ And God said, ‘I will be with you.’”

EQUIP

SET THE SCENE: Moses is one of the most famous people in the history of the Bible. He struggled with this idea as well. Moses was raised an Egyptian royal, took part in a murder, fled Egypt and was living as a shepherd. *This* was the man God called to lead all of Israel out of Egyptian captivity. Moses knew his limitations (he was a murderer and had a speech impediment amongst other earthly limitations), and he allowed his limitations to define the purpose that God had for him.

How does God respond to Moses? He simply says, “I will be with you.” God didn’t give Moses all the specifics of His plan, and God didn’t grant Moses supernatural power to overcome the obstacles in his way. God just used Moses’ trust and did the rest. Moses’ story is about God’s power on display, not his own.

What does this scripture say about me and my relationship with God?

- God doesn’t always ask the most equipped person to partake in His calling, rather He calls ordinary people and equips them for His calling. God’s presence is the *only* prerequisite in being a part of his plan. God is calling us to things daily that require us to trust Him.

What does this say about my relationship with others?

- God wants to use us to reach His people. Somewhere along the faith journey, we are all asked to step out in faith and follow His calling so that others will see God's heart and character. Our obedience to God's calling is all He asks for.

How does this relate to sports?

- Has a coach ever asked you to do something that you thought was impossible for you? Did you defy your coach and say no, or did you obey and try your best? Chances are we have all been asked to do something we don't feel confident doing. A coach calls players into growing opportunities for the betterment of themselves and the team. God does the same. He takes ordinary people and uses them for the extraordinary. All that is asked of us is that we obey.

Spend time in small groups discussing the following questions:

EMPOWER CHALLENGE

This week, think about the areas of your life where you don't feel good enough to carry out God's plan. How do you need to respond? God is most likely prompting some of you to repent, some of you to trust him and some of you to receive the truth about who you are.
